Patna, 25 April. A condolence meeting in memory of the renowned Statistician and Economist of Bihar, Professor Prabhat P Ghosh, was organized by the Asian Development Research Institure (ADRI) today. Professor Ghosh was the Member-Secretary of ADRI.
