Ara, April 2. Asian Development Research Institute (ADRI) and Bihar Swasthya Suraksha Samiti (BSSS) jointly organized a **One Day Training Programme on the Transaction Management System (TMS) 2.0** for the doctors and Arogya Mitras of private and government hospitals of Buxar, Rohtas, Kaimur, and Ara Districts today. These hospitals are enlisted under the government of India's flagship Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY) health insurance scheme. TMS 2.0 is an upgraded website portal of this scheme. ADRI provides technical support to BSSS for the roll-out of the scheme in Bihar. Both institutions are located in Patna.
